

Confidentiality of Information

What Records are Covered?

IDEA Part B	FERPA		
Education Records The type of records covered under the definition of "education records" in FERPA Records that are collected, maintained, or used 34 CFR §300.611(b). Records on a student receiving services under Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) are "education records" subject to FERPA.	Education Records Records that are - Directly related to student; and Maintained by an educational agency or institution or by a party acting for the agency or institution 34 CFR §99.3.		
Educational records containing student information may include enrollment forms, report cards, transcripts, school-related discipline reports, Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), evaluation assessments, immunization records, progress monitoring, and more.			



Education Records Follow-Up

from the March 11, 2022 SEAC Meeting

What happens to documents that contain Personally Identifiable Information (PII) sent via email?

- Stored in the Department's secure permanent online database.
- Gmail encrypts all emails while in transit preventing anyone who intercepts the email
 from being able to read the email or attachment(s) and all documents stored in Google
 Drive are encrypted at rest using 128-bit AES keys which is an approved encryption
 standard by the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) and the National
 Security Agency (NSA).
- All staff are required to sign the General Confidentiality Expectations.
- All contractors must abide by confidentiality agreements and must sign a Data Sharing Agreement which includes privacy and destruction of clauses in the contract's terms and conditions.



Student Information Privacy

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

believe are inaccurate or misleading

Each year, Hawaii public schools are required to notify parents of their rights under FERPA. These rights are generally broken into four sections. Here is a brief description of FERPA rights:

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the request.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent, guardian, or eligible student
- 3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education record except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception that permits disclosure without
- consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests.
- 4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the school to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

The Quick Guide to Student Information Privacy provides a condensed version of the more detailed parent notification and guide. Parent Notification and Guide to Student Information Privacy in Hawaii's Public Schools

Each year the Hawaii Department of Education (HIDDE) is required to notify parents, legal guardians and eligible students (those 18 years of age and older) of certain rights related to the privacy of students' education records in Hawaii Public Schools. In our efforts to provide this information to families, HIDDE reviewed state and federal regulations related to student information privacy and developed this Guide.

Notice to Parents 34 CFR §300.612

The Department must give notice that is adequate to fully inform parents about confidentiality of personally identifiable information, including:

 A summary of the policies and procedures that participating agencies must follow regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention, and destruction of personally identifiable information; <u>and</u>

IDEA Part B

Confidentiality Provision 34 CFR §300.623(a) HAR §8-60-84

Each participating agency must protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information at the collection, storage, disclosure, and destruction stages.

HIDOE Source Document, Policy

Collection: Evaluation, Identification, Placement, and Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)/development of the IEP.

Storage: Cumulative records are kept in secured file cabinet or a permanent secure database such as electronic Comprehensive Student Support System (eCSSS).



IDEA Part B

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HIDOE Source Document, Policy

Disclosure: When is consent required?

Parental Consent must be obtained before PII is disclosed to parties, other than officials of participating agencies, unless the information is contained in education records, and the disclosure is authorized without parental consent under FERPA.



IDEA Part B

Confidentiality Provision 34 CFR §300.623(a) HAR §8-60-84

HIDOE Source Document, Policy

Each participating agency must protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information at the collection, storage, disclosure, and destruction stages.

Destruction: Education records in the confidential files for students with disabilities must be maintained for three years after a student graduates with a diploma or ages out at the 22nd birthday. However, on a case-by-case basis, it maybe determined that these records must be maintained beyond this period, e.g., due process, compensatory services, etc.



IDEA Part B

Confidentiality Provision 34 CFR §300.623(d) HAR §8-60-84

The Department must maintain, for public inspection, a current listing of the names and positions of those employees within the Department who may have access to personally identifiable information.

HIDOE Source Document, Policy

A list of Authorized State-Level Personnel to Review Personally Identifiable Information of Students with Disabilities under IDEA is sent to the schools and updated annually.



IDEA Part B Confidentiality Provision 34 CFR §300.623(b) HAR §8-60-84	HIDOE Source Document, Policy
One official at each participating agency must assume responsibility for ensuring the confidentiality of any personally identifiable information.	The Principal/Designee is identified at the School level.



IDEA Part B

Confidentiality Provision 34 CFR §300.623(c) HAR §8-60-84

All persons collecting or using personally identifiable information must receive training or instruction regarding the State's policies and procedures under 34 CFR §300.123 and 34 CFR part 99.

HIDOE Source Document, Policy

All Department staff and adult volunteers are required to complete the FERPA 101 Training and obtain certification.

The certification for all employees is valid for 5 years from the date of training.
