  - 1. <u>HB 388</u> Requires HIDOE to obtain instructional materials in accessible formats for eligible students
  - 2. <u>HB 830/SB 605</u> Requires HIDOE to meet with Hawaii School for the Deaf and Blind stakeholders to develop plan to transition to a conversion charter school
  - 3. <u>HB 834/SB 610</u> Recognizes American Sign Language as a distinct language with its own rules, structure and cultural heritage
  - 4. <u>HB 1296</u> Establishes an early intervention working group to recommend ways to assist and support deaf and hard of hearing children.
  - 5. <u>HB 1042/SB 1340</u>\*\* Exempts teachers working in collaboration with a licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist from behavior analyst licensing requirements. Allows a registered behavior technician under the direction of a licensed psychologist to implement ABA services.
  - 6. <u>HB 548/SB 308</u>\*\* Develops curricula for students, training for teachers and information for parents about sexual abuse/sex trafficking.
  - 7. <u>HB 793/HB 934</u>\*\* Authorizes schools to have staff to administer/assist with seizure disorder rescue medication.
  - 8. <u>SB 1151</u>\*\* Makes it easier for students who have received a certificate of completion from high school to access the UH Community College Promise Program
  - 9. <u>HB 80</u> Authorizes school complex areas to use authentic assessments as part of classroom-based performance assessments.
  - 10. <u>SB 672</u> Allows the Hawaii ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund to provide incentive payments to Hawaii public school ABLE account owners
